*There are many requirements for a fumigation to take place. A fumigation management plan is necessary for each site. A certified applicator must be present during the fumigation and any persons assisting must have documented training. There are training requirements for receipt of in-transit vehicles under fumigation. Refresher training must be done annually and documented, and the records maintained. An inventory of fumigation products must be recorded. Phosphine must be transported in accordance with DOT regulations. All these aspects of fumigation will be discussed.*
